State Law/Attendance Policy/Who may register/Cost: The student taking the course must turn 16 years of age on or before October 15th, 2011—no exceptions—*please do not ask for one*. Students who have previously been unsuccessful in driver education (at RHS or elsewhere) *will* be accepted. The Jordan School District fee for the class is \$140 per student and is not subject to a fee waiver. State law requires that students receive 30 hours of Driver Education classroom instruction. Any absence for any reason will count against a student's 30 hours of classroom time. **PLEASE DO NOT REGISTER FOR THIS CLASS IF YOU CANNOT MEET THE ATTENDANCE REQUIREMENT. PLEASE DO NOT register for this class if you cannot attend classes on the dates/times listed above. Please do not ask for special arrangements to alter the above dates or times—it simply cannot be done—I cannot schedule classes that will not conflict with every camp, vacation, youth conference, trek, job, etc. I have to teach this class when I am available to teach. Please check with other high schools in our area to see if their schedule may accommodate you. This class is rigorous and requires students to work very hard and complete a significant amount of work in a very short amount of time. Be prepared and get motivated!!**

Please follow the specific instructions on the registration checklist that follows this page. If you are reading this on the school website, you may print the registration materials. If you cannot do this, hard copies of this packet are available at the main offices at RHS, OHMS, or SHMS. In order to officially register for this class, students must submit a **completed “Summer School Drivers Education 2011” application, a photocopy of his/her birth certificate, and the \$140 fee** to an RHS Main Office secretary—do *not* take your applications to Valley H.S. or one of the middle schools! **Absolutely no incomplete applications will be accepted. Applications will be processed on a first-come, first-served basis at R.H.S. A maximum of 70 students (35 in two classes) will be registered.** After the class has 35 registered students, a waiting list will be created and you will be notified if an opening occurs. It is quite rare for students to drop out once registered.

IMPORTANT: Please understand that our “summer” course classroom phase will be taught in July, *but* actual driving instruction (range and road) continues throughout the rest of July, August, September, October, November, and beyond that. *If you are looking to get a driver license “quickly”, this is NOT the program for you.* We service about 1,000 students per year who vary in age and skill level. *When you finish your driving will not depend solely upon your age and desire (or your parent's desire) to get a license. Your eligibility date to apply for a license and availability of road teachers are the two things that first determine when a student will drive.* After that, skill level, practice hours completed, and your attitude all play a significant role in when you will finish all Dr. Ed. requirements. Birthdate & when you take Dr. Ed. is of lesser importance in determining when you will finish. Currently (March 2010) we are ahead of schedule in finishing motivated students who follow procedures and demonstrate appropriate driving skill and attitude.

REGISTRATION CHECKLIST

- I have read the registration information and understand the attendance policy for RHS Summer Dr. Ed.
- I understand that my son or daughter cannot legally drive on the road with anyone until he/she is issued a valid learner permit. You are strongly encouraged to get your permit before the class begins.
- I have read the *"How Do I Get a Learner Permit?"* checklist.
- I have completed the SUMMER SCHOOL DRIVERS EDUCATION -201-1 application (available on the RHS website). I understand incomplete applications will not be accepted and will not reserve a spot in the class.
- I have a photocopy of the student's birth certificate (must turn 16 on or before 10/15/11—no exceptions—*please don't ask for one*).
- I have paid the \$140 fee to the RHS Main Office and received a receipt.
- I have submitted the application, fee receipt, and photocopy of student's birth certificate to an RHS main office secretary.
- I have told an RHS secretary my preference for Session #1 or Session #2 (see schedule for specific times--35 maximum per class—first-come, first served).
- I have received a copy of the Utah Driver Handbook from an RHS secretary and I understand that I must encourage my son/daughter to read it several times before 7/5/11.

How Do I Get a Learner Permit? (in case you haven't read it already!!)

- Turn **15** years of age—it is best to wait until 15 years and 2-3 months of age as it is very difficult for some to finish all requirements before the 16th birthday—many students won't even finish the classroom portion before that date.
- Pass the state written test** at the D.L.D. This is the recommended option. You may take the test twice in the same day and once on another day for the \$15 learner permit fee—if you need to take the test a fourth time or more, you will need to pay an additional \$15. The sooner you get your permit, the sooner you will be eligible to apply for a license—you must hold a learner permit for 6 months before applying for a license unless you have already turned 18 years of age when your learner permit is issued.

OR

- Pass the state written test** at R.H.S. during the summer class and receive a certificate from your teacher that verifies you passed the written test.

If you have passed the state written test, be prepared to do the following . . .

- Go to the **D.L.D.** (*please, please, please, DO NOT go to the D.M.V.!!!!!!*) with a **parent or guardian** to apply for a learner permit (you may already be there!). Take the following items with you:
 - Picture I.D.
 - Contacts or glasses (if you wear corrective lenses)
 - Social security card or ITN card (individual tax number)
 - Original or certified copy of birth certificate (*no photocopies or miniature birth certificate wallet-sized cards will be accepted*)
 - \$15 learner permit fee
 - Certificate verifying you received a passing test score (If you passed the test at R.H.S.)
 - Parents need to bring 2 (two) of the following items that will prove Utah residency: recent bank statement, credit card bill, or utility bill; or vehicle registration. No cell phone bills will be accepted as proof of residency.
